Projects at a Glance

Choice 1: Public Service Announcement/Social Experiment

Create a video that *either*:

- Exposes acts of racism/stereotyping/profiling in your community. Your video should raise awareness, change public attitudes and behaviors towards this social issue.
- Reveals acts of kindness and acceptance towards different cultures and religions. Your video should restore some faith in humanity, raise viewer's hopes, and encourage others to act in the same way.

Choice 2: A Picture is Worth a Thousand Words

Using 10 photos tell a story of racism/stereotyping/profiling. You should attempt to capture the inciting moment (cause), the climax, and the resolution (effect). With each photo, write a brief description/reflection about what is happening or the feelings being presented in the photo. The writing should not over power the photos, but enhance the theme, raise question(s), and provoke audiences to think.

Choice 3: Actions Speak Louder than Words


Expression is not limited to words and more often than not, actions speak louder than them. Challenge yourself to go beyond your comfort level and use movement and contemporary/modern/hip hop dance to tell a story of racism/stereotyping/profiling. You should attempt to capture the inciting moment (cause), the climax, and the resolution (effect).

Choice 4: Let it Go

In a Slam Poem express your frustrations, your realizations, your ideas and your hopes towards racism/stereotypes/profiling. You may choose to share a personal story of discrimination, or use class activities to fuel your poem. You should attempt to capture inciting moments (cause), and the resolution (effect).

Choice 5: Your Choice

Throughout the unit, you may come up with your own ideas for a final project. If you have your own ideas, please pursue them!

Choice 1: Public Service Announcement/Social Experiment

Create a video that *either*:
